

Outbreak Update

First of all, I wanted to start by explaining why residents are isolated and eating in their rooms. Some residents have had potential exposure to COVID-19 through interactions with loved ones or a sitter. As a result, we are taking the necessary precautions to keep all residents safe. For at least 14 days, residents will continue to be isolated to their rooms as per public health requirements.

On a positive note, after testing staff on Tuesday, January 5 and residents on Wednesday, January 6, there are no new staff or resident cases as of January 7th at 2pm.

We will have another testing day for residents on Wednesday, January 13th.

Clarity on Donning and Doffing outside of B/C wing

Anytime you leave the B/C unit, you must doff your current gown and don a new gown, wash your face shield and put on a new mask.
